District Rotary Awards Seek Nominations

District 5960 Service Above Self Award - Award recognizes individual service provided, both in their role as Rotarian and other volunteer efforts.

Criteria: The nominee must have demonstrated exemplary humanitarian service, in any form and at any level, with an emphasis on personal volunteer efforts and active involvement in helping others through Rotary. Service rendered by the nominee through Rotary must have been on a continuing basis. The award will not be given solely in recognition of one's performance in an elected or appointed Rotary assignment. Personal financial contributions to the Rotary Foundation or any individual project are not relevant considerations for this award.

This award will take the place of what was the Touching Hearts Award, and the District will submit a maximum of 3 nominations from our district for the RI Service Above Self Award. The awardees will be recognized at the Rotary 5960 District Conference and at their individual clubs for their service.

District 5960 Best Cooperative Projects Award

Award honors Rotary clubs that have successfully cooperated with non-Rotary organizations, to include projects undertaken by multiple Rotary clubs in cooperation with other non-Rotary clubs. Awardees will be recognized at the Rotary 5960 District conference and at the club level. Recognition of service efforts provided in collaboration with groups outside of Rotary, integrating our efforts as Rotarians with other organizations, and benefitting from the multiplier effect of combined resources and efforts.

Criteria: Project must have been a service activity that addresses a humanitarian need; Projects that were designed to promote a fundraiser are not eligible; Those projects that require active involvement of Rotarians will be given priority; and the project must have been well established during the 12 months prior to March 15th.

District 5960 Significant Achievement Award

Award recognizes a single club activity that addresses a community problem or need, to encourage new projects on the part of every club, and to promote increased awareness of the importance of exemplary club efforts. Awardees will be recognized at the Rotary 5960 District conference and at the club level. **Strategic purpose:** To encourage all clubs to identify community needs, and to undertake activities to address one or more needs in local communities.

Criteria: Address a significant problem or need in the local community; Involve most or all of the club in personal rather than monetary service; Be commensurate with the size of the club and the resources available; Enhance the image of Rotary in the community; and Be able to be emulated by other Rotary clubs; Be currently active or reaching a conclusion during the Rotary year for which the award is being given.

Deadline for submission to Rotary 5960 District Governor is April 1st.
